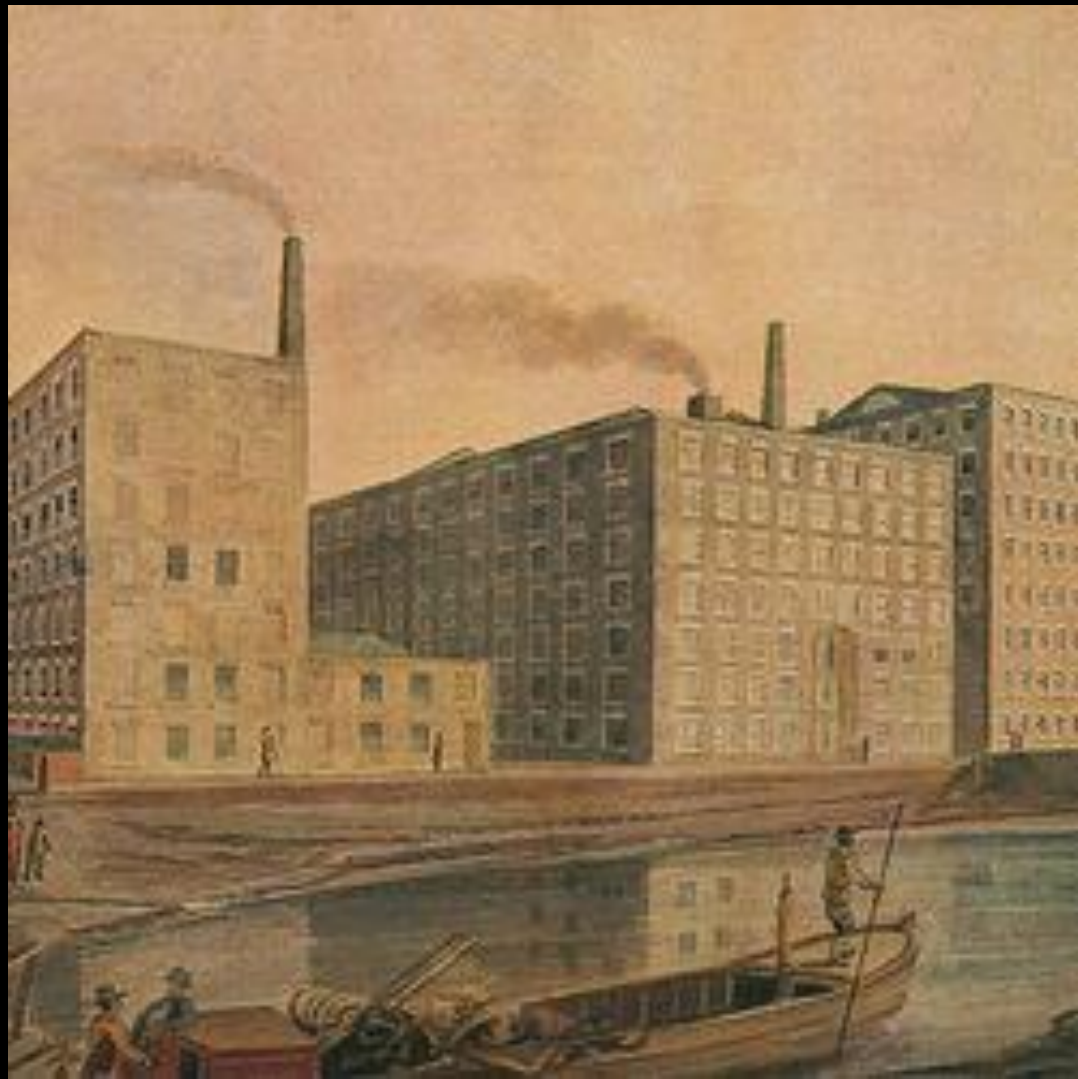












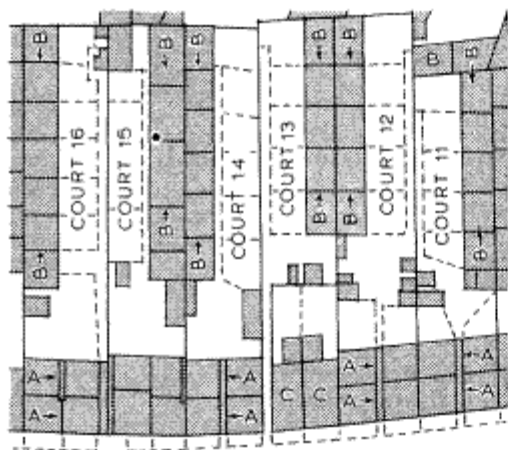






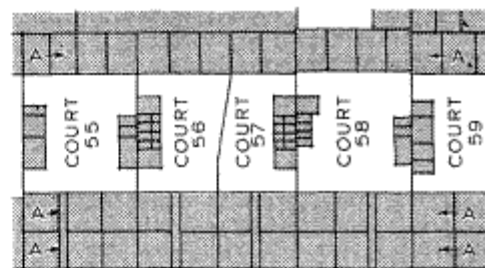






GREAT COLMORE STREET

B↔B Two-storied back-to-back houses

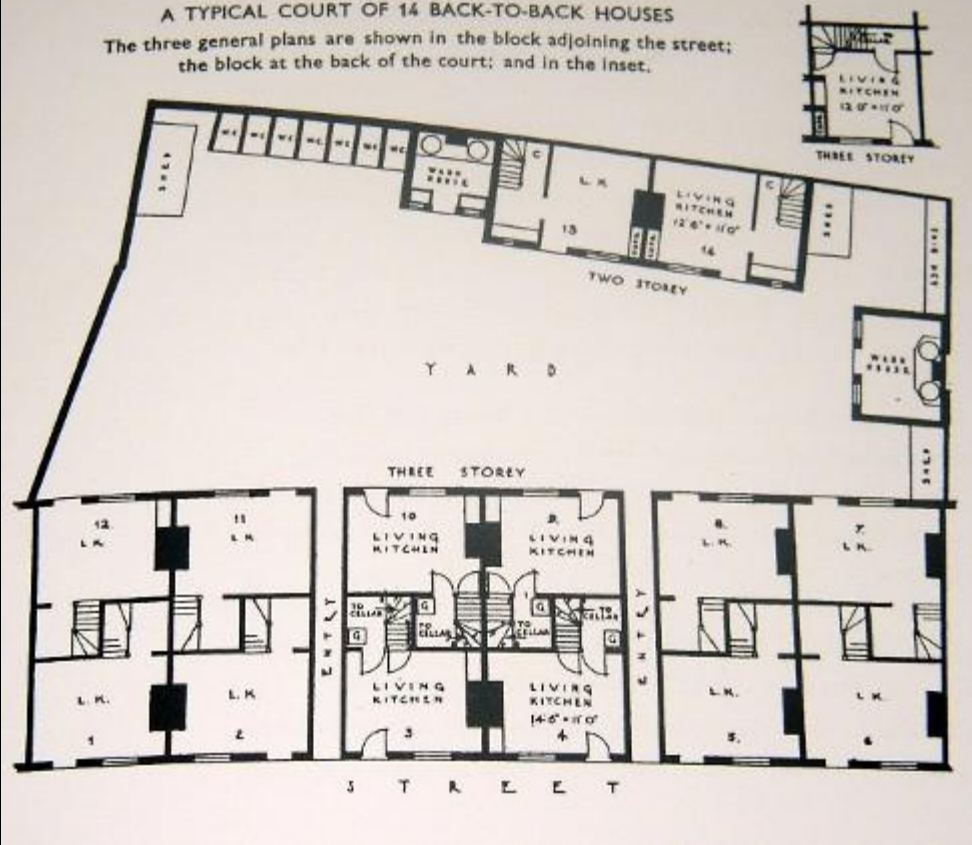

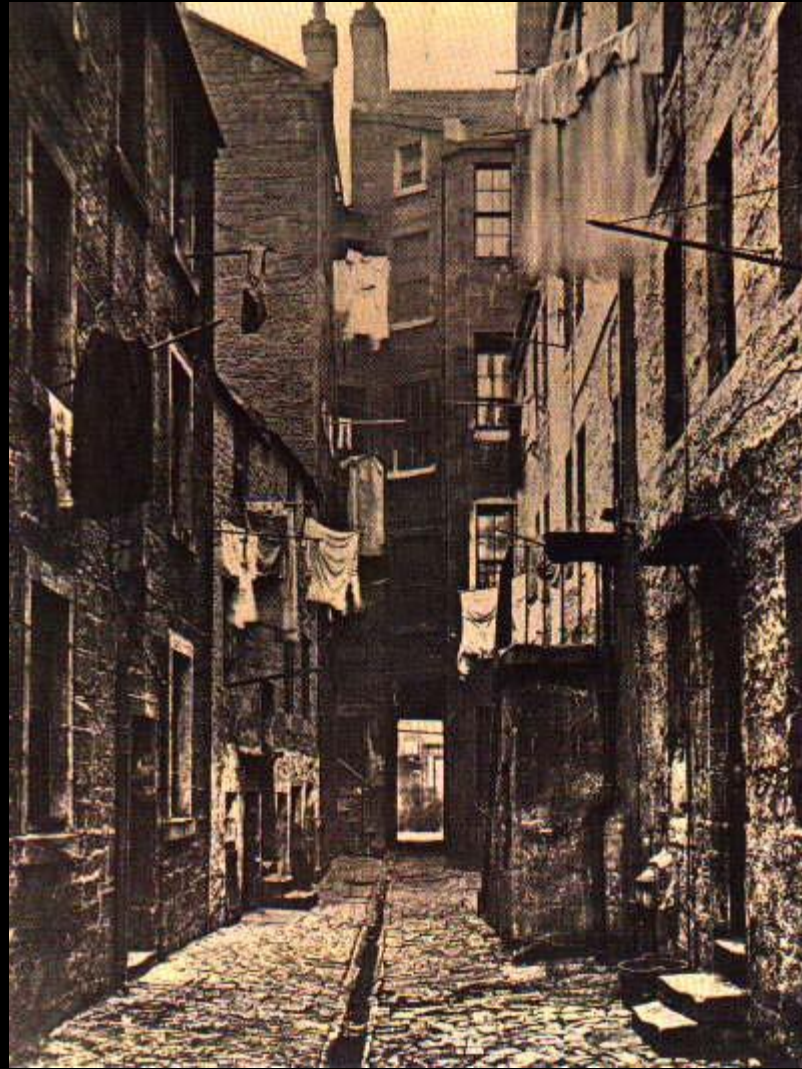

The three general plans are shown in the block adjoining the street; the block at the back of the court; and in the inset.

































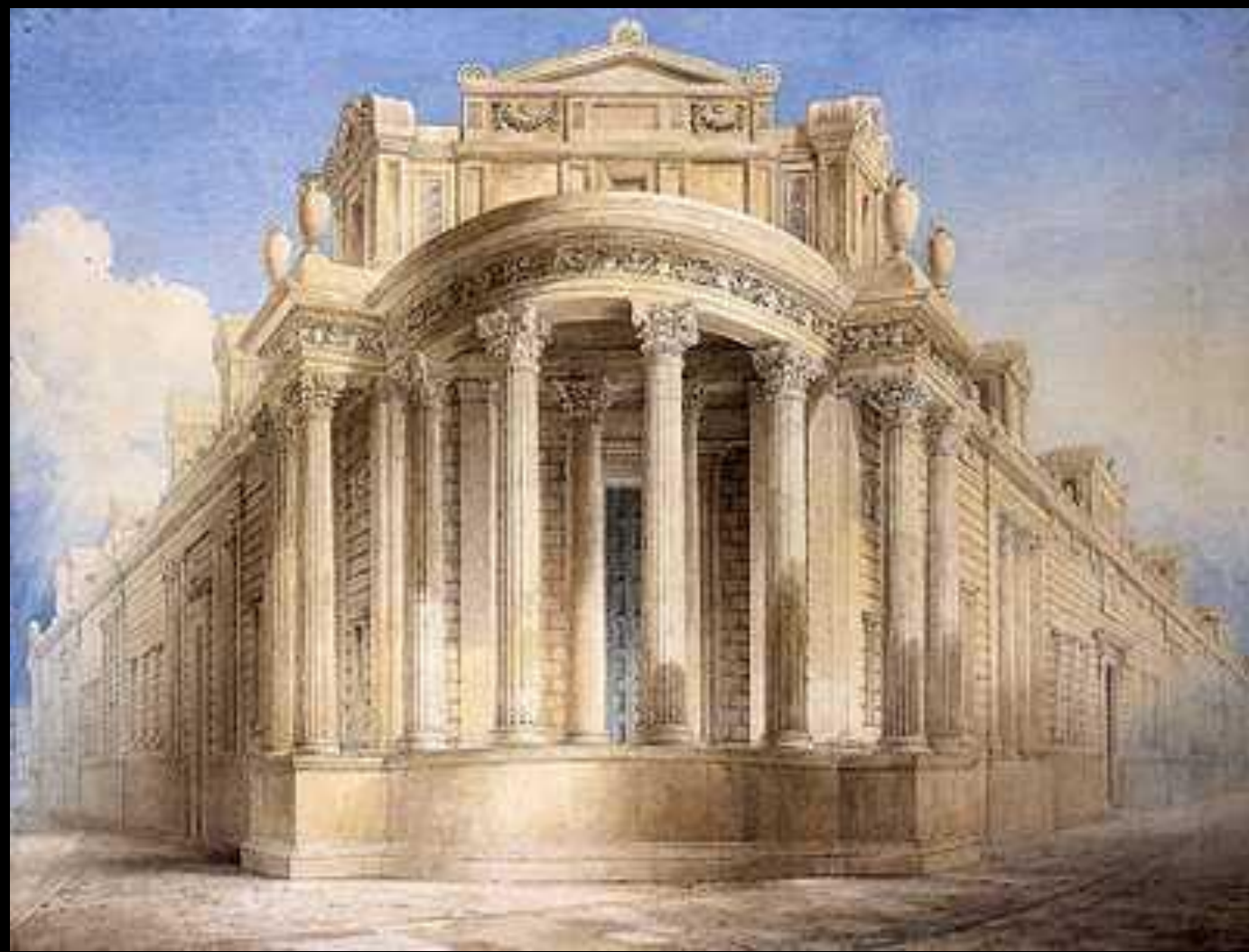
