HISTORY OF TWINNING

836 AD Paderborn, Germany and Le Mans, France

1905 Keighley West Yorkshire, England twinned with Suresnes & Puteaux France

After the Second World War in 1947, twinning was intended to foster friendship and understanding among different cultures and between former foes as an act of peace and reconciliation, as well as encouraging trade and tourism

1989 town twinning was supported by the European Union through a twinning scheme; there are now more than 7,000 bilateral relationships with 10,000 European Municipalities

By the 2000s, town twinning became increasingly used to form strategic international business links among member cities


Why not use Gross Domestic Product? "Only measures output"

On January 4, 1934, economist Simon Kuznets presented the US Senate with the first set of national economic accounts that added up total economic activity now known as Gross National Product. GDP and GNP are very similar measures. But neither tell us about the health of the economy or about the quality of our lives in terms of the real things that matter to real people





DEVELOP personal links and learn from each other through visits and exchange of ideas




