


The Boleyn family tree





Prideaux 1725






Hever Castle Phase II (probably 1461-3)




THE YULE LOG






Thomas de Hever temp. Can. III is said to have built this Castle. John one of the Daughters & Heires

Bulden K. of the Garter & Earl of Whitesore on the Dissunder of his Son George Bulden vis. London A.D. 1556




