The INTERNATIONAL AFRICAN SERVICE BUREAU is a non-party organisation which owes no affiliation or allegiance to any political party, organisation or group in Europe. It fights for the demands of Africans and other colonial peoples for Democratic rights, civil liberties and self-determination.

MEMBERSHIP. (a) Active membership is open to all Africans and peoples of African descent, regardless of nationality, political creed or religious faith, who accept its aims and abide by its Constitution.

(b) Associate Membership is open to Europeans and members of other races who sympathise with the aims and objects of the Bureau and desire to demonstrate in a practical way their interest in Africans and peoples of African descent.

IMMEDIATE DEMANDS OF THE BUREAU. The Bureau sets as its immediate programme to work for the following:

1. The right of African peoples to form Trade Unions, Co-operative Societies, and such organisations that seek to protect their economic, social and cultural rights.

- 2. A minimum standard of wages in keeping with the cost of living.
- 3. The eight-hour day and forty-eight hour week, and such regulations governing working hours as obtain in democratic countries.
- 4. Equal pay for equal work, regardless of colour.
- 5. The removal of discrimination in the Civil Service against Africans and peoples of African descent.
- 6. The abolition of forced labour, hut and poll-tax, pass laws, etc.
- 7. Freedom of the Press, movement, and assembly.

AFFILIATED MEMBERSHIP. There is no conflict between the Bureau and other existing organisations which work for the emancipation of the Negro. The Bureau does not attempt to usurp or in any other way monopolise the activities of such organisations. It aims at co-ordinating and centralising the activities of the various organisations—be they political, Trade Union, Co-operative, Fraternal, Cultural, etc., which at present exist in different parts of the black world, and in this way to bring them into closer fraternal relation.

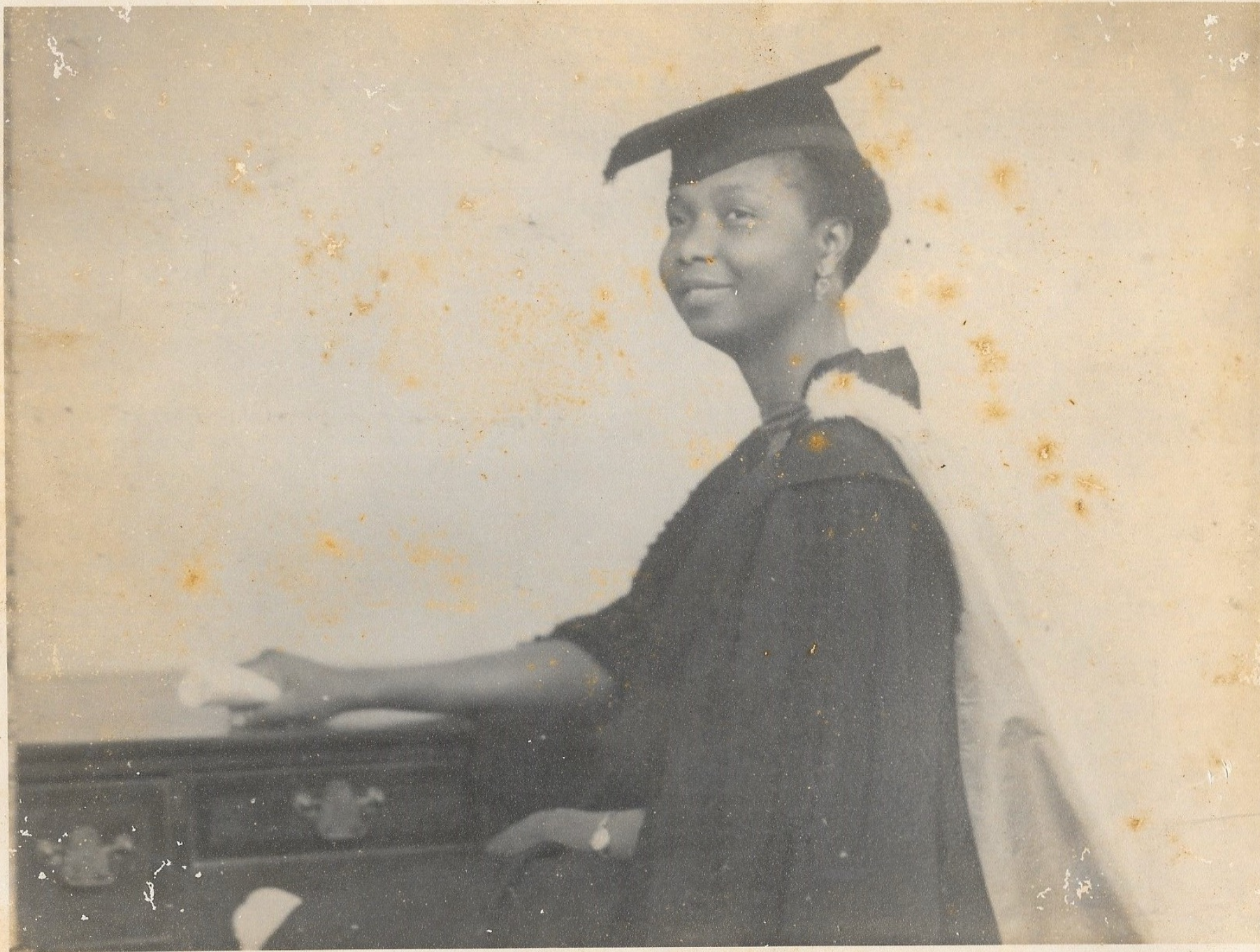

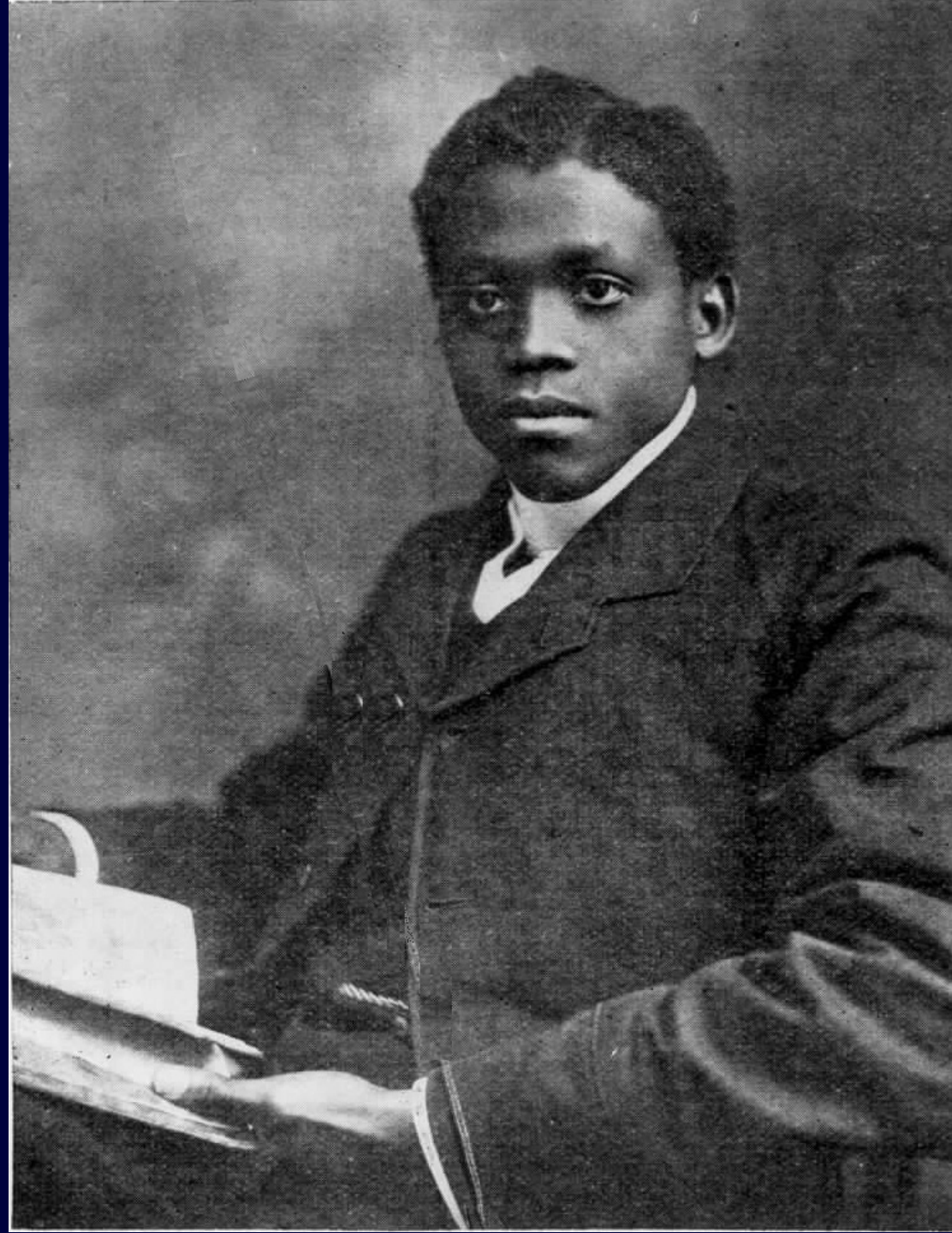

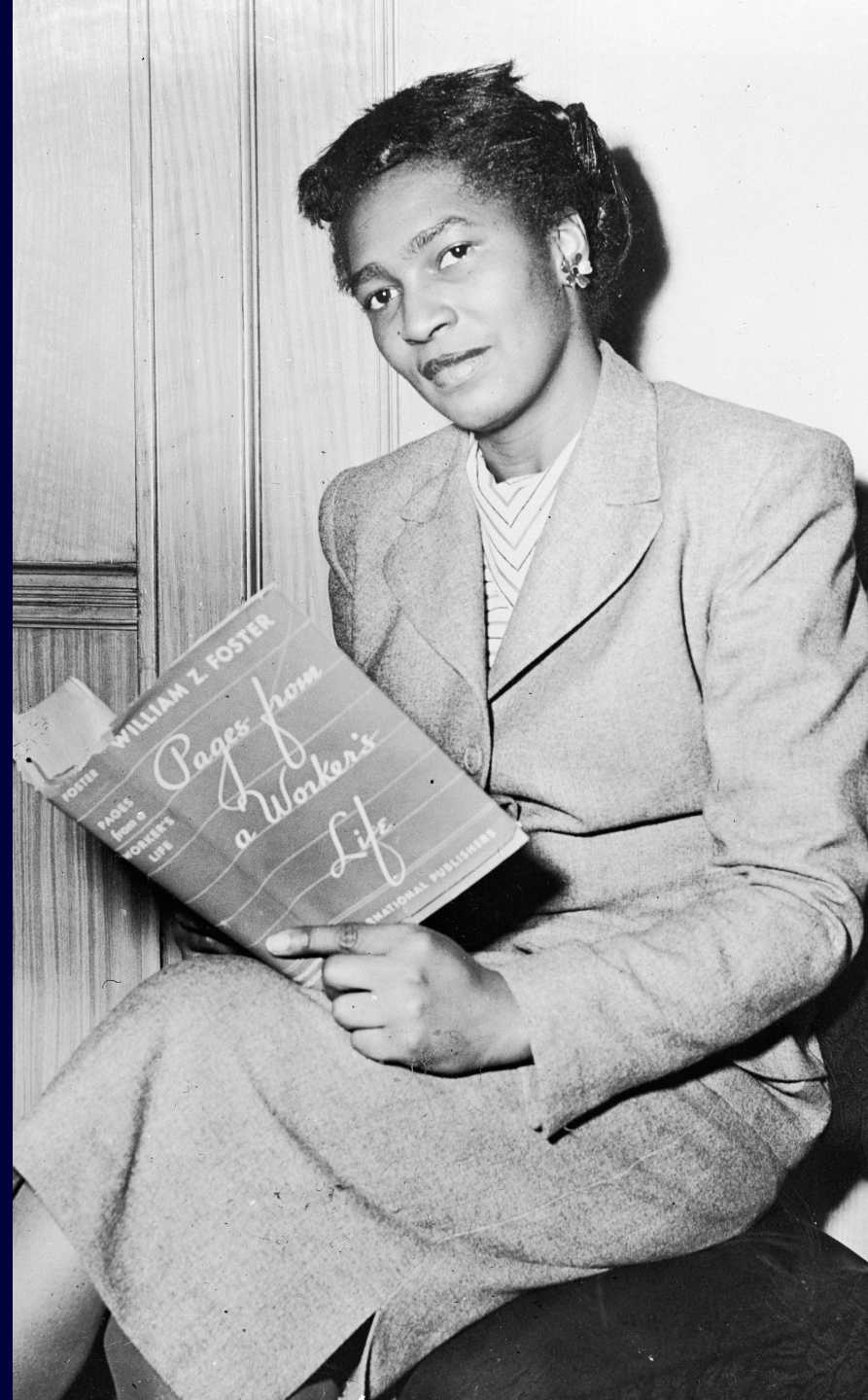
