



Exhibitionists

Committing an "act", not exhibiting a specific <u>"</u>identity"

Term 1st used by Charles Laséque in 1877 English: 1st used in Charles Gilbert Chaddock's translation of <u>Psychopathia</u> <u>Sexualis (</u>1893)

The exhibitionist became a persona Shift from legal term to psychiatric one


Foucault:


