







The Racialization of Illness

### Sickle Cell is recessive:

There is a difference between possessing the sickle cell *trait* 

and having sickle cell disease or anemia



### Sickle Cell:


Haemoglobin A

in the red blood cell

is replaced by haemoglobin S.


As haemoglobin S releases oxygen,
haemoglobin polymers stretch the cells
into the crescent shape of a sickle.
