TWO YOUTHS LEAVE POLICE STATION

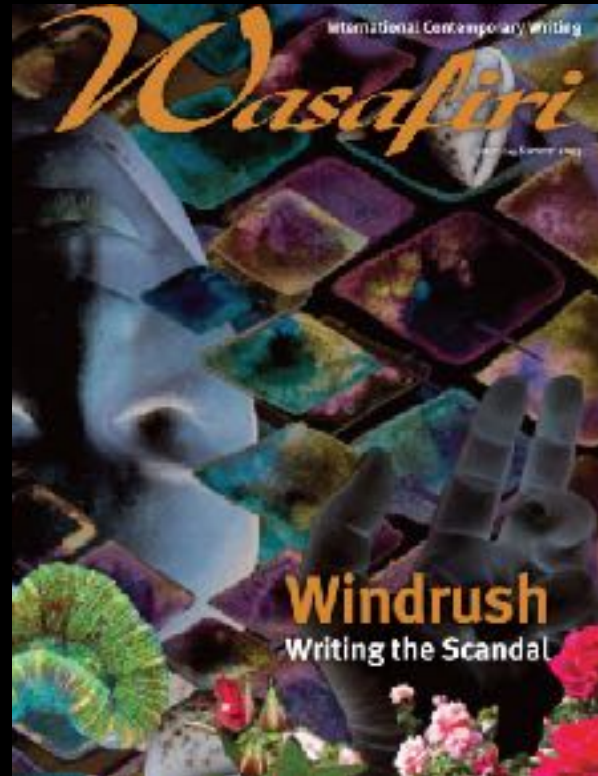
INTERVIEWS OVER DEATH OF WEST INDIAN

The two youths who had been at the police station at Harrow Road, W., throughout Tuesday and yesterday being interviewed by police inquiring into the death of **Kelso Cochrane**, a West Indian carpenter, in north Kensington on Sunday, went home last night. No one else was at the police station being questioned.

Detectives in charge of the case were investigating further information which they received late yesterday afternoon.

A letter has been sent to Mr. Butler, the Home Secretary, from the African and West Indian organizations in London asking him to receive a deputation to discuss the latest racial disturbances in Notting Hill and other places.
